## Remembrance

To commemorate Remembrance Day and to teach the importance of remembering the sacrifices of those who served our country during the wars, our children and staff have created an art installation.

We wanted to create something that would be meaningful, memorable and to make an impact to help our children understand the significance of this anniversary.

Many thousands of soldiers lost their lives during the various wars over the years and this is sometimes difficult to visualise large numbers.

So we have created our own visual army. Each child and adult were given a wooden dolly peg and asked to design their own soldier to be part of a battalion.

They considered the facial expressions on their soldier, researched uniforms from past and present, discussed colours including camouflage and the King's guard colours, thought about extra details such as helmets, berets and backpacks and carefully considered the materials they would need to create their peg doll soldier.

The care and consideration taken whilst making each soldier was incredible and the children are very proud of their creations. I am sure you will agree the impact of our battalion of soldiers together is astonishing!



#### Outdoor Adventures

Earlier this term, some of the Y4, Y5 and Y6 children were taught different survival skills for living outdoors. They now know a range of different commands such as: take a knee, disperse, take cover, break cover and drone and can camouflage themselves in any eventuality! On week 3, the children were very excited to build a fire and learn about smoke signals; they even enjoyed toasting marshmallows. The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

#### Fencing

Children in Year 3 to Year 5 had the opportunity to experience a new sport - fencing.

Children learned how important discipline is within the sport and they also learned the basic moves involved in a mini dual.

The coaches who delivered the fencing lessons were very impressed by children's behaviour and attitude towards this new experience.

#### Move with Max

This half term the children in reception are taking part in Move with Max - a physical activity program to help young children to develop their movement skills. The children are thoroughly enjoying the activities all based around an under the sea theme. Each week the children have worked on different skills and are confident in how to jump, balance, climb and move in and out of spaces carefully. For many children in reception, PE is a new experience but they have all certainly had lots of fun, developed lots of skills and worked really hard.

#### **Sports Hall Athletics**

A team of year 5 and year 6 children took part in the Darlington Sportshall Athletic Competition at the Dolphin centre. The children took part in running, throwing and jumping events. Points are awarded for each event and our school earned enough points to finish in second place, which means that the children have qualified for the Sportshall final taking place on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November.
